As I reflect upon the first year as Chair of the Board of Trustees, I recognize that we must continue to move forward in order to overcome the challenges facing Hanover College, to ensure that we provide the highest quality educational experience for our students, and to foster a welcoming environment where our employees and campus community feel valued and empowered.

The challenges facing Hanover College and other liberal arts institutions have been well-documented across a variety of media. Often, these challenges are enumerated to include the following:



WINNING SPIRIT – ATHLETICS

Over half of the student population at Hanover College participates in Panther Athletics. In recent years, as students' desire to continue competing has met our coaches' commitment to providing a meaningful Division III experience, athletics has played a vital role in recruiting undergraduate students and enriching their campus experience.

Like the alumni who have competed before them, today's student-athletes learn how to prioritize, manage their time, overcome adversity, contribute as a team member, and form lifelong friendships. For these reasons, and many more, over 600 alumni and friends gave on our inaugural Athletics Day of Giving in February 2023.

As a result of the generosity of many donors, several endowed funds for athletics have also been created over the past several months, including the Hanover College Athletics Endowed Fund for Excellence, created by Rich Blaiklock '90 and Mindy Pflum Blaiklock '91, Wiley Kite '90, Rick Patberg '90, Ron Patberg '90, and Chris Stark '91. This fund and many others will ensure athletics remains a vital part of the undergraduate experience for generations of Panthers to come.





GREEK LIFE

As proud alumni members of Hanover College Greek Life, Wes '76 and Mary Burch Ratliff '78, recently chose to make a major contribution to the renovation and maintenance of Lambda Chi Alpha and Alpha Delta Pi. Like many of their fellow alumni, they value their fraternity and sorority memories and lessons and recognize that while the core values of leadership, service, and community remain, today's members seek a different residential experience which will require significant investment in each chapter house.

Fifty three percent of undergraduate students were affiliated at the end of the 2022-2023 Academic Term. With membership trending up over the past few recruitment cycles, the College is confident that continued investments in chapter houses, as well as the recently-implemented dining, maintenance, and staffing plans, will ensure this vital part of the undergraduate experience.



in a **WELCOMING COMMUNITY ...**

Communities are strengthened when each member feels safe and welcomed. Our campus community is no exception, and that is why we are intentional in creating a place where every member belongs so that every member can grow and thrive. In myriad ways, Hanover College and our donors are ensuring that each student, employee, and guest feels at home here.

In 2023, we were recognized as one of the top colleges for economic diversity by the New York Times, a ranking that reinforces Hanover's long-held reputation for being affordable and financially accessible to the best and brightest students, regardless of their family's household income.

Even the brightest among us can have barriers to navigate, and we are continually working to ensure those barriers are minimized. Work has already begun

to create more ADA accessible spaces, as many of our oldest and most cherished buildings require renovation and updates to ensure all members of the campus community and our guests can easily and safely access them. And, in the Gladish Learning Center, the Student Success team, including dozens of trained peer tutors, offer individualized support to all undergraduate students, whether it's one-time help with a difficult assignment, or comprehensive learning accommodations.

Across campus, there are countless opportunities for students to find their people. More established groups like Evil Petting Zoo, Love Out Loud, and the Geology Club continue to play an active role on campus, and they are joined by a host of others, including Black Student Union, Project Cocoon, the Beekeeping Club, the Hanover College Drumline ... and so many more.

Perhaps some alumni will remember rare sightings of College Presidents' pets through the years. Today, as Hanover aims to become the most pet-friendly campus in the country, campus community members find delight in their daily encounters with the many furry friends who reside on campus.

BARON SOCIAL JUSTICE PROGRAM

Several years ago, Hanover College launched the Benjamin Templeton Program, an initiative aimed at recruiting and educating students with an interest in living out our mission of meaningful service through a focus on social justice issues. During its proud tenure, this program has resulted in dozens of meaningful, student-led initiatives, from tearing down a "Wall of Hate" comprised of hurtful words and educating the community on human trafficking, to providing resources for victims of domestic abuse and creating opportunities for students of color.

With a gift from Linda Pirtle '73 and Mark Baron, the College named its first Baron Professor of Social Justice this year and enrolled its first 12 students who will reside together at the Ogle Center, take courses toward a Social Justice Certificate, engage in meaningful service projects and graduate with the tools and information needed to ensure our shared community beyond Hanover College is a place to belong for all.

while serving as the foundation for launching in-demand **GRADUATE PROGRAMMING ...**

Hanover College is committed to meeting the needs of today's students and today's world. While undergraduate programs and students remain our priority, we are simultaneously designing and implementing graduate programs to meet the demands of the market and address the realities of an aging population.

At Commencement in May 2023, we graduated our first cohort of Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) students, an exciting milestone in our journey to grow our national reputation in graduate programming. As DPT continues to educate current students and recruit new classes, the Doctor of Occupational Therapy program is preparing to launch in 2024, offering new opportunities to enroll students from across the country and prepare them to meet the demands of the industry and our communities.



and delivering **EXCEPTIONAL** **ALUMNI OUTCOMES.**

When students walk across the stage and receive their diploma each year, they are beginning a lifelong alumni journey with us. As a campus, we are committed to ensuring our alumni are well-positioned to succeed in their careers and communities, connected to Hanover College and each other, and offered ample opportunities to support our mission and today's students. By all counts, our alumni demonstrate growing engagement and love for their alma mater each year.

While recruitment, retention, and graduation remain critical metrics of success, the College also reaches out to alumni each year to gather data and feedback on our longer-term impact on graduates. The report from the Class of 2022 demonstrates that we remain effective in preparing students for meaningful careers and graduate education. At the time of the report, 94 percent of graduates shared that they had secured employment, and 95 percent reported that they had successfully enrolled in postgraduate programs.

Outcomes like these are possible due to our alumni advocates, volunteers, and donors. Over the course of the past few years, the COACH Mentoring program

has grown to 200 alumni mentors, with several being matched with a student for a year-long commitment to sharing advice and offering support. For the first time this fall, every first-year student interacted with a COACH volunteer through an assignment that gave the students an opportunity to gain practical experience and information while highlighting the lifelong connection between Hanover College and its alumni.

Our students also benefit from the 100+ alumni who are engaged in our Alumni Leadership Council and alumni advisory committees. These volunteers greet first-year students during Move-In Day, select our annual Alumni Achievement Award honorees, share insight on campus issues and support the work of the Business Program, Greek Life, Athletics, and many other departments across campus.

And of course, perhaps no metric showcases alumni engagement better than our alumni participation rate. With steady growth over the past several years and a stunning 23% rate to end 2023, our alumni show their commitment to and belief in our mission with their annual gifts of every size.




TOTAL INVESTMENTS

BUDGETED INCOME





COMMUNITY RESPONSIBILITY


- I will participate in decision-making on rules and procedures, and will encourage others to do the same.
