**Dr. Michella Marino**, an oral historian by training, is a 2004 graduate of Hanover College and lived in downtown Madison while completing her M.A. in History at University of Louisville. She then earned her Ph.D. in American History from the University of Massachusetts Amherst and taught at a small liberal arts college in Nebraska before returning to the Hoosier state to spearhead the Indiana Legislative Oral History Initiative (ILOHI). She then became the Deputy Director of the Indiana Historical Bureau, a division of the Indiana State Library. Dr. Marino is a former roller derby skater and recently published a book with the University of Texas Press titled *Roller Derby: The History of an American Sport*, which was in large part based on oral histories with former skaters.

Ben Baumann has a Bachelor's degree in History from Saint John's University, a small liberal arts college in Minnesota and a Master's Degree in History from the University of Amsterdam in the Netherlands. After graduate school, he returned to his home state of Kansas to work as a Legislative Fellow for the Kansas Legislative Research Department. In 2019, he joined the Indiana Historical Bureau to become the new oral historian for the Indiana Legislative Oral History Initiative (ILOHI). In addition to the ILOHI, he has also conducted oral histories on topics ranging from space travel, military leadership, and historical memory. He has a dog named Plato.
